

A New Chapter

Since opening in 1973, the Toronto Women's Bookstore has been a central hub for feminists. Besides being a positive space for women, the bookstore is also the ultimate source for Canadian feminist literature. It is the largest non-profit feminist bookstore in Canada and at the end of 2009, was on the verge of closing its doors forever.
